COVID Relief Update

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- On May 3, HHS announced a new COVID-19 Coverage Assistance Fund (CAF). Since providers cannot bill patients for COVID-19 vaccination fees, the CAF is intended to address an outstanding compensation need for providers on the front lines vaccinating underinsured patients.
- CAF is focusing on instances where individuals have insurance, but vaccines are either not covered or are but typically with patient cost-sharing.
- To address these gaps, the CAF will be compensating providers for eligible claims, at national Medicare rates.
 - In March, those rates increased from approximately \$28 to \$40 for the administration of single-dose vaccines and from approximately \$45 to \$80 for the administration of COVID-19 vaccines requiring two doses.



- To be eligible for this fund; providers must:
 - Administer the vaccines regardless of the recipient's ability to pay COVID-19 vaccine administration fees or coverage status;
 - Must administer COVID-19 vaccine at no out-of-pocket cost to the recipient; and
 - Must first seek appropriate reimbursement from a program or plan that covers COVID-19 vaccine administration fees for the vaccine recipient.
- The CAF will accept eligible claims for insured individuals that were vaccinated on or after December 14, 2020.
 - Claims must be submitted electronically
 - All reimbursement is subject to availability of funds.



• What will the CAF cover:

• Eligible providers will be reimbursed at national Medicare rates for vaccine administration fees, and for any patient cost sharing related to vaccination, including: co-pays, deductibles, and co-insurance.

• How to File a Claim to CAF:

- Providers may enroll in the program through the HRSA COVID-19 Coverage Assistance Fund (CAF) Portal <u>https://bit.ly/3aSyijU</u> and agree to the Terms and Conditions, including accepting defined program reimbursement as payment in full and agreeing not to balance bill the patient.
- After submitting a claim(s) for COVID-19 vaccine administration fees to patients' health plan carrier for payment, if the claim is either denied by that insurer or only partially paid, providers may then submit a claim(s) to the CAF Portal for payment consideration.
 - Providers must also verify no other third party payer will reimburse them for vaccine administration fees for that patient encounter.
- Claims are accepted via clearinghouses or through electronic or manual submissions via the CAF Portal.

HHS Provider Relief Fund – Targeted Rural Relief

- On May 4, 2021, HHS committed \$1B to targeted rural relief. The funds will be allocated in three distinct ways:
 - HRSA's Rural Health Clinic COVID-19 Testing and Mitigation Program will provide \$460 million to more than 4,600 rural health clinics (RHCs) across the country.
 - RHCs will use the funds to maintain and increase COVID-19 testing, expand access to testing for rural residents, and broaden efforts to mitigate the spread of the virus in ways tailored to their local communities.
 - HRSA will provide up to \$100,000 per RHC-certified clinic site and will issue the funds this summer.
 - HRSA will provide \$398 million to existing grantees of the Small Rural Hospital Improvement Program (SHIP) to work with approximately 1,730 small rural hospitals – those with fewer than 50 beds – and Critical Access Hospitals on COVID-19 testing and mitigation.
 - <u>SHIP state grantees will use the funding to support all eligible rural hospitals, up to \$230,000 per hospital, and will issue the funds later in the year.</u>



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- Finally, through the Rural Health Clinic Vaccine Confidence (RHCVC) Program, HRSA will make nearly \$100 million available in grants to eligible RHCs nationwide to address health equity gaps by offering support and resources to medically underserved rural communities where COVID-19 vaccine uptake lags in comparison to more populated areas.
 - HRSA will fund all eligible RHCs that apply.
 - Details about the application process are still pending.
 - RHCs will be able to use the funds to increase vaccine confidence, improve health care in rural areas, and reinforce key messages about prevention and treatment of COVID-19 and other infectious diseases.



HHS Provider Relief Fund – Still to Come.....

- Estimated PRF Fund Availability: \$32B with \$7.5B (\$1B just announced) specifically earmarked for rural providers.
 - Rural Provider Distribution will require an application process. HHS Secretary has broad powers to define "rural" providers.
- Eventual Reporting on the Use of PRF Funds
